BACKGROUND

Designed by Thomson Rossi and Brown Falconer, South Australia's Morialta Secondary College is a modern school built to reflect the state government's educational ambitions and the region's natural beauty.


Combining timeless architecture with innovative learning spaces, this inspiring design reflects the local landscape of gullies and ridgelines, creating a unique environment that connects students to Country.

CHALLANGE

With six learning precincts spread across three levels and two buildings, creating a unified campus identity was essential. At the same time, it was crucial to ensure each precinct retained its unique character and the facility was easy to navigate.

To help address these challenges and accommodate a wide range of interdisciplinary activities, the flooring had to be durable, flexible and high-performing. Additionally, it needed to help communicate the school's bespoke, landscape-inspired story and serve as a practical wayfinding tool.





SOLUTION

Interface carpet tiles were chosen for their robustness, versatility and exemplary environmental credentials, but it was their customisation that truly unlocked the project's vision. Working closely with the Interface Design Studio, the project team selected the pronounced texture and organic patterns of the Net Effect Collection as a base. From there, they collaborated to create custom designs inspired by the nearby Morialta National Park.




The ability to weave in custom yarn colours which suit the design intent proved pivotal in allowing different characters of place to occur while enabling a consistency of internal expression across the campus,"

She notes that the collaborative process included detailed renders of the custom product within educational settings and physical samples to perfect the integration of colours into the Net Effect Collection textures.

The resulting flooring scheme seamlessly blends creativity with functionality. A warm, sophisticated base tile provides a cohesive backdrop, while two tiles with deeper, custom tones define specific zones and help connect various precincts across the college.

Rooted in biophilic inspiration, this bespoke solution aids navigation, promotes student well-being and weaves the story of the local landscape into their learning journey, transforming a heavy-duty commercial carpet into a design tool that delivers a resilient and intuitive educational hub deeply connected to its setting.
